The product is designed to provide a return in the form of (1) regular fixed interest payments and (2) a cash payment on the maturity date. The amount of this payment will depend on the performance of the underlying. The product has a fixed term and will terminate on the maturity date. If, at maturity, the final reference level of the underlying has fallen below the barrier level, the product may return less than the product notional amount or even zero.

Interest: On each interest payment date you will receive an interest payment of GBP 4.80. The interest payments are not linked to the performance of the underlying. The relevant dates are shown in the table(s) below.

Termination on the maturity date: On the maturity date you will receive

- 1. if the **final reference level** is at or above the **barrier level**, a cash payment equal to GBP 1,000.00; or
- 2. if the final reference level is below the barrier level, a cash payment directly linked to the performance of the underlying. The cash payment will equal (i) the product notional amount multiplied by (ii) (A) the final reference level divided by (B) the strike level.

Under the product terms, certain dates specified above and below will be adjusted if the respective date is either not a business day or not a trading day (as applicable). Any adjustments may affect the return, if any, you receive.

The product terms also provide that if certain exceptional events occur (1) adjustments may be made to the product and/or (2) the issuer may terminate the product early. These events are specified in the product terms and principally relate to the **underlying**, the product and the issuer. The return (if any) you receive on such early termination is likely to be different from the scenarios described above and may be less than the amount you invested.

When purchasing this product during its lifetime, the purchase price may include accrued interest on a pro rata basis.

You do not have any entitlement to a dividend from the underlying and you have no right to any further entitlement resulting from the underlying (e.g., voting rights).

- 2. they seek income, expect the movement in the underlying to perform in a way that generates a positive return. They have a long investment horizon;
- 3. they are able to bear a total loss of their initial investment, consistent with the redemption profile of the product at maturity (market risk);
- 4. they accept the risk that the issuer or guarantor could fail to pay or perform its obligations under the product irrespective of the redemption profile of the product (credit risk);
- they are willing to accept a level of risk of 3 out of 7 to achieve potential returns, which reflects a medium-low risk (as shown in the summary risk indicator below which takes into account both market risk and credit risk).

The risk indicator assumes you keep the product for 6 years. The actual risk can vary significantly if you cash in at an early stage and you may get back less. You may not be able to sell your product easily or may have to sell at a price that significantly impacts on how much you get back.

The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets or because we are not able to pay you.

We have classified this product as 3 out of 7, which is a medium-low risk class. This rates the potential losses from future performance at a medium-low level, and poor market conditions are very unlikely to impact our capacity to pay you.

To the extent the currency of the country in which you purchase this product or your account currency differs from the product currency, please be aware of currency risk. You will receive payments in a different currency so the final return you will get depends on the exchange rate between the two currencies. This risk is not considered in the indicator shown above.

Investment performance information

Main factors likely to affect future returns on the product

Your return on the product at the end of the recommended holding period will principally be affected by (1) the price at which you purchase the product, (2) the performance of the **underlying** over the recommended holding period and (3) the ability of the issuer and guarantor to make payments that become due on the product. The value of the product before

the maturity date will also be affected by general economic and market conditions, the volatility of the underlying (which is a measure of the extent of movement in the level of the underlying), interest rates, the remaining time to maturity and the ability of the issuer and guarantor to make payments.

What could affect my return positively?

• The product provides a return in the form of fixed rate interest payments and, as such, there are no factors that could positively affect your return.

What could affect my return negatively?

- · A decrease in the level of the underlying
- · The occurrence of a barrier event
- The issuer's and the guarantor's inability to make payments on the product when they fall due

The factors listed above provide general guidance on how changes in the level of the **underlying** may affect your return if you purchase the product at inception and hold it to the end of the recommended holding period. If you purchase or sell the product after inception, your return on the product will also be affected by the purchase or sale price and the level of the **underlying** at the time of sale or, in the case of a purchase, at and following the time of purchase. 3. What happens if Morgan Stanley B.V. is unable to pay out?

You are exposed to the risk that the issuer or guarantor might be unable to meet its obligations in connection with the product for instance in the event of bankruptcy or an official directive for resolution action. This may materially adversely affect the value of the product and could lead to you losing some or all of your investment in the product. The product is not covered by any deposit protection scheme.

4. What are the costs?

The Reduction in Yield (RIY) shows what impact the total costs you pay will have on the investment return you might get. The total costs take into account one-off, ongoing and incidental costs.

The amounts shown here are the cumulative costs of the product itself, for three different holding periods. They include potential early exit penalties. The figures assume you invest GBP 10,000. The figures are estimates and may change in the future.

5. How long should I hold it and can I take money out early?

Recommended holding period: 6 years

The product aims to provide you with the return described under "1. What is this product?" above. However, this only applies if the product is held to maturity. It is therefore recommended that the product is held until 27 June 2031 (maturity).

The product does not guarantee the possibility to disinvest other than by selling the product either (1) through the exchange (if the product is exchange traded) or (2) off-exchange, where an offer for such product exists. Save as otherwise disclosed in exit costs (see section "4.
